Minutes of the June 17, 2015 Meeting

Ms. Birkmire moved to reduce the office space and benefit budget, and delay additional salary increases until September 1. Mr. Lerner seconded the motion, which was approved unanimously.

Director's Report

Ms. Adams reviewed progress with regard to the grant requests related to the HVAC and reorganization of the Children's Department.

Ms. Adams reviewed the circulation and library usage statistics with the Trustees.

Ms. Adams presented the summer reading event brochure to the Trustees.

Ms. Adams discussed upcoming adult events with the Trustees.

The trustees discussed a leave of absence for an employee.

Facilities Committee

Mr. Harding reported to the Trustees on progress with regard to Project 2020.

Friends of the Library Report

Mr. Harding reported that the Friends of the Library were willing to pay the costs associated with the new floor in the circulation area of the library. Ms. Birkmire noted that this was not part of earlier funding promised to the library.

It was further reported that the Friends of the Library were investigating options for investing additional funds.

Closed Session

Mr. Lerner moved to close the meeting to discuss the performance and compensation of an employee. Ms. Birkmire seconded the motion, which was approved unanimously.
