Narrative re: Budget impacts (cuts, additions) on service

- Public Service hours (Contact and Contactless): 3,321
- Saw an increase of 14% to previous year's budget but still utilized some of the organizations unrestricted reserve fund
- Awarded \$25,000 in private donations for Rock Hall
- Relocated and Renovated North County Branch- almost tripling the space from 1800 sq.ft. to 3,500 sq.ft.
- Spent \$72,000 renovating staff work area and break room
- Relocated Rock Hall Branch to a more centralized location
- Hired three new full time employees and three part-time employees which aided in the expansion of programming at Rock Hall and North County branches
- Continue to see a steady increase in library card sign ups which increased by 4.4% over previous year
